Hi Curtis,

While reviewing your site plan, we looked up the "Master Easement," 2022-004856,

which provides greater information about the shared easements between your property and that to the north. Our code requires that properties with shared access must provide written permission from all persons with an interest in that access. Additionally, the written permission should include the stairway, as that is the main access to the home.

On October 14<sup>th</sup> I sent you a completeness review indicating the applicant has 180 days from the date an application was first submitted to make the application complete. On the 181<sup>st</sup> say, the application becomes void (April 10<sup>th</sup>). While we can technically deem your application "complete" with the site plan you've now provided, the missing permission from the shared access could cause delay or denial of your project. Please let us know if you intend to submit additional information for your application, or if we should proceed with scheduling a public hearing for your application as-is.
